

## Canberra to Bungendore

From **Canberra**, take the **Kings Highway/National Route 52** to **Bungendore**. Stop here for a coffee and stroll through the **Wood Works Gallery** or continue on towards **Goulburn** and **Tarago**.

## Bungendore to Tarago

Take **Tarago Road** out of Bungendore, and continue on, crossing the railway near the Tarago village centre. A popular stopping point is Tarago's **Loaded Dog Hotel**, named after the humorous short story by Australian writer Henry Lawson and famous as a 'safe house' for bushrangers such as Frank Gardiner and Ben Hall in the 1860s.

## Tarago to Nerriga

The road out of Tarago (**Lumley Rd**) crosses the Braidwood–Goulburn Road and continues on through a line of pines along **Cullulla Road**. Turn left at the T-intersection onto **Sandy Point Road** and then, after a few kilometres, right onto **Oallen Ford Road**, near Windellama. The road crosses the Shoalhaven River at the new Oallen Ford bridge, and there's a rest stop on the opposite side of the river. You can see remnants of the old bridge and ford where pioneer bullock drays crossed, and take a paddle in the river.

Oallen Ford Road ends at a T-intersection with **Nerriga Road**, turn left towards **Nerriga**. Nerriga is a small village on the edge of Morton National Park. The iconic **Nerriga Hotel** is a great spot for lunch or refreshments, with live music on the last Sunday of each month.

## Nerriga to Nowra

Continue along **Nerriga Road** following the signs to Nowra. At the Endrick River crossing the road becomes **Braidwood Road** and winds its way past beautiful sandstone cliffs at Bulee Gap. It is still possible in places to view the original road built by convicts in 1841. Further along at **Sassafrass**, chestnuts may be for picking and sale in season around March/April.

For a spectacular view, turn-off to **Tianjara Falls** lookout.

As you approach the Defence base, HMAS Albatross, turn left onto **Albatross Road**, then along Kinghorne Street to arrive in Nowra township.

## Nerriga to Jervis Bay

To travel to **Jervis Bay** or **Ulladulla**, turn right from Braidwood Rd at **Turpentine Road** toward Tomerong. Sealing of this road is complete. At the **Princes Hwy**, turn left and look for for the **Jervis Bay** turnoff for Jervis Bay, or turn right to continue along the highway to **Mollymook** and **Ulladulla**.

# Recently upgraded & fully sealed, take the road less travelled from Canberra to the coast

Main Road 92 is the shortest route to the white sand beaches of Jervis Bay as well as Canberra's closest surf breaks. Enjoy the 2.5 hour drive through quaint country towns, Morton National Park's breathtaking sandstone escarpments and convict history to arrive at the unspoilt coast.

## Enjoy the road less travelled

- check your vehicle and fill the tank before you leave
- plan to travel during daylight hours for safety and spotting wildlife
- use your mobile phone's map facility if needed, however mobile reception may be patchy
- carry drinking water, but refreshments can be purchased at Nerriga and Tarago during opening hours



## FROM CANBERRA TO SHOALHAVEN

- 1 Take Kings Hwy to Bungendore
- 2 Take Tarago Rd to Tarago
- 3 Take Lumley Rd which continues on to Cullulla Rd
- 4 Turn left into Sandy Point Rd
- 5 Turn right into Oallen Ford Rd
- 6 Turn left into Nerriga Rd
- 7 Nerriga Road continues on to Braidwood Rd
- 8 Continue on to Nowra or turn right at Turpentine Rd for Jervis Bay
